

ACTION:

- 1) Chose your topic
- 2) Find examples and quotes to support your view
- 3) Write a plan (this must be submitted before you begin writing)

The plan must include:

- Clearly write the question you have chosen
 - Using the essay format (see attached sheet), write in dot points an outline the points you are going to make
 - Provide page references from the text to support your points
- 4) Submit plan to teacher (teacher will check and assist if necessary)
 - 5) Write your essay

Introduction

- Remember to include the writer of the text and underline or italic the name of the text
- Rewrite the question in your own words
- Expand upon the rewritten question so that it becomes clear what is your main focus of the response (This may be the naming of characters or themes to be looked at)

Main Body

- For each paragraph, begin with a clear and concise topic sentence that highlights what aspect that paragraph will be about in relation to the question
- Elaborate with direct (quotes) and indirect evidence (use page references to support your viewpoint)
- Check your paragraphs at the end to see if they have addressed the main focus of the question

Conclusion

- Summarise your main ideas in response to the question
- DO NOT raise any new points
- (Optional) End with a suitable with a suitable quote from the text that seems to sum up the entire response

*** Extras**

- DO NOT write "I" or "MY" anywhere in your response
- Make sure your topic sentences are clear and concise
- Make sure you ALWAYS link back to the question throughout each paragraph
- DO include lots of evidence to support your points (This may be direct quotes or indirect paraphrasing)
